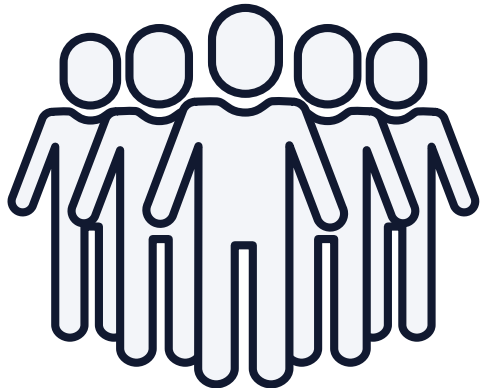

41



41 men sought support, healing, and a second chance at life through our long-term residential treatment and independent living and recovery programs.

20



After graduation, more than 20 of these men had maintained their recovery at a 3-month follow-up.

Long-Term Residential Treatment Completion

46%



46% of men in long-term residential recovery completed their individualized treatment programs -- better than the 42% national average (per SAMHSA, 2020).

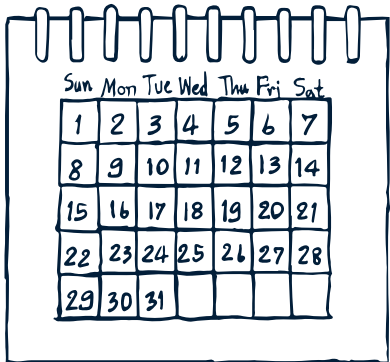

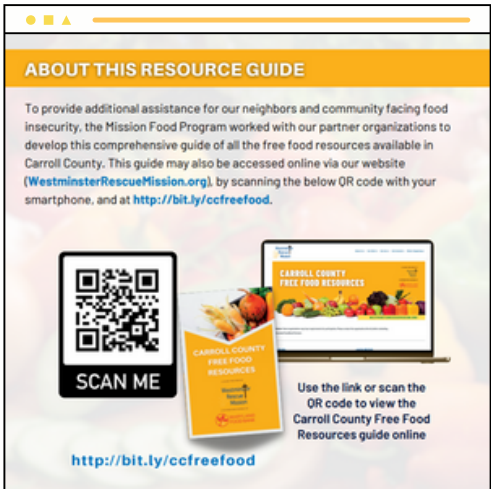

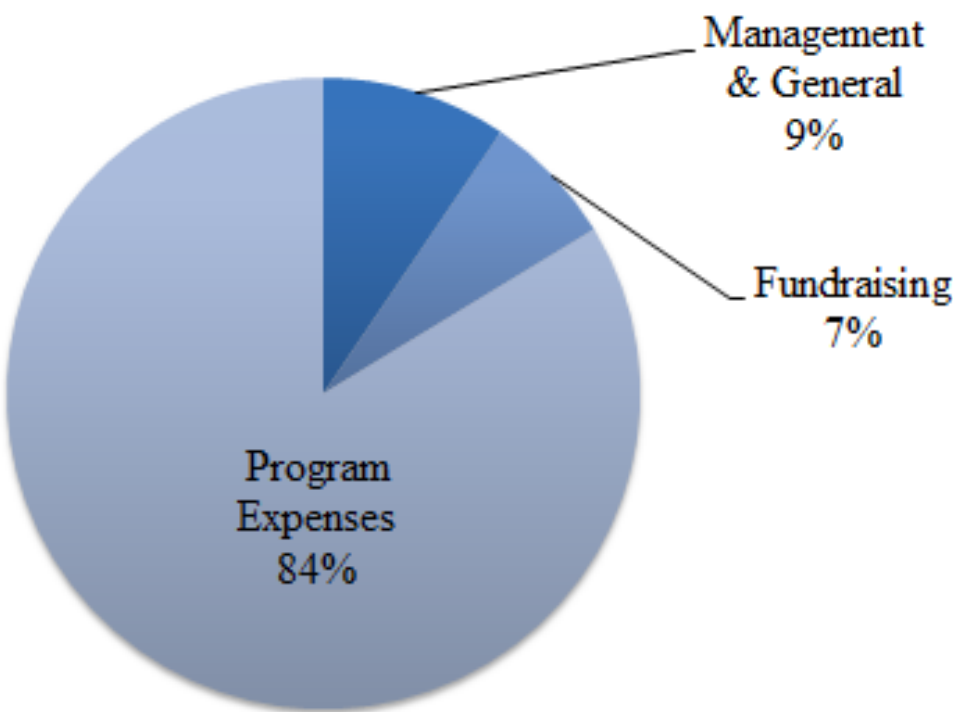
