Recovery Housing for Pregnant Women & Women with Children

We are excited to announce a major milestone for our Women's Program—the acquisition of a dedicated property that will serve as a safe, nurturing space for women in recovery and their children. This initiative allows mothers to heal while maintaining family unity, providing stability, support, and access to essential resources.

Key Features of Our New Women's Recovery Program:

- A safe and supportive off-campus farm home designed for mothers in recovery.
- Integrated 12-step meetings and peer support groups to foster healing.
- Strong connections with recovery and faith-based communities.
- A peaceful retreat space dedicated to rest and rejuvenation.
- Workforce development & case management.

In the coming months, our team will work together to assist women in rebuilding their lives, focusing on workforce development and providing the resources needed for a successful transition.

We will focus on patient-centered improvements to the property, such as a security system, expanding accessibility, etc. to create a space where women can rebuild their lives with dignity and purpose.

Pantry-on-the-Go: Expanding Access to Fresh Produce

Beginning in October 2024, in response to an increasing need for nutritious food, the Westminster Rescue Mission brought a new source of food into the county. **Pantry-on-the-Go (POTG)** distributions takes place every month in Union Bridge, thanks to the Maryland Food Bank.

This initiative provides fresh produce, allowing us to distribute a total of **3,262 pounds** of produce since October. By increasing access to healthier options, we continue to make a lasting impact on local families.




Westminster Rescue Mission Hosts Carroll County Food Network
